# Weigh value of WRWSA membership

January 16, 2018

THE ISSUE: BOCC ponders pulling out of or dissolving the regional water authority. OUR OPINION: Don't be so hasty.

Ask any 25 people in the county to explain what the Withlacoochee Regional Water Supply Authority (WRWSA) is, what it does, and how Citrus County benefits —and you'll most likely be zero for 25.

The WRWSA doesn't send out water bills, doesn't issue regulations and isn't a regular participant in community gatherings. Since it's not in the headlines all the time, even those who are familiar with the authority might forget about it.

Now, members of the Citrus County Board of County Commissioners are talking about pulling the county out of the WRWSA, or trying to dissolve it altogether. They say that it's costly and may not operate in our county's best interests if other counties want to get access to our water supply.

We say not so fast.

Apparently commissioners have forgotten how the authority began, what it has done to safeguard our county's — and region's — water, and its importance in future water management.

A little history: Water supply authorities are authorized by Florida Statute, Chapter 373.713, "for the purpose of developing, recovering, storing, and supplying water for county or municipal purposes in such a manner as will give priority to reducing adverse environmental effects or excessive or improper withdrawals of water from concentrated areas."

That last part, about reducing improper withdrawals, is important. WRWSA, encompassing the four counties of Citrus, Hernando, Marion and Sumter by interlocal agreement, was created in 1977 amid a concern about water transfers. The Tampa urban area was looking longingly at our area's water to supply its growing population. The WRWSA was able to defend with a united front for our four counties, and the "Local Sources First" concept took hold.

WRWSA's mission is to plan for and develop cost efficient, high-quality water supplies for its member governments, promote environmental stewardship through conservation programs and develop alternative water sources to augment groundwater supplies to meet our region's long-term needs.

The Southwest Florida Water Management District (SWFWMD) has a history of supporting a regional approach to managing water resources. Its 2015–2019 Strategic Plan includes partnering with WRWSA to promote regional water supply planning and development.

An important regional support program is SWFWMD's Cooperative Funding Initiative (CFI), which helps water supply authorities by funding up to 50 percent for projects that help create sustainable water resources, enhance conservation efforts, restore natural systems and provide flood protection. For 2019, Citrus County has filed CFI applications for 12 projects totaling more than \$32 million. The county has benefitted from a number of other projects and studies previously.

Yes, there's a cost to member counties for membership in the WRWSA. Each is assessed based on population served by member governments. In Citrus, the authority-owned Charles A. Black wellfield facility is operated and maintained under contract by Citrus County.

Water management is a long game. At WRWSA's 40th anniversary recognition last year, state Sen. Wilton Simpson presented an official proclamation of support, and other speakers commended WRWSA for 40 years of working collaboratively "to ensure adequate drinking water supplies for the region while promoting natural resource protection."

The concern expressed by some county commissioners that continued membership in WRWSA would be harmful to Citrus County's future is misplaced. We're concerned that commissioners could make a short-term decision to save a very small amount of money, and in so doing endanger our future water management capabilities.
