The Withlacoochee Regional Water Supply Authority (WRWSA or Authority) is requesting "Statement of Qualifications" (SOQ) from consultants interested in providing professional engineering services to complete the project known as the "Regional Water Supply Plan (RWSP) Update." Work will require multidisciplinary expertise in addition to engineering, including hydrogeology, planning, environmental systems, and water quality.

The Authority's RWSP was last updated in 2014. This work effort will include updated water demand projections, evaluation of source options and potential water supply project options. The update of the WRWSA RWSP will include: updating population projections; existing and future water demands for public supply and other water use categories; traditional and alternative water supply availability; regional groundwater modeling; estimates of the amount of future demands that could be offset through enhanced water conservation efforts; reclaimed water availability and potential offsets; and recommendations regarding the WRWSA Regional Framework.

This project is cooperatively funded by the Southwest Florida Water Management District (SWFWMD). Firms providing professional services for the project must demonstrate compliance with applicable rules, regulations and policies of the Authority and SWFWMD.
