#### Item 8. SWFWMD Cooperative Funding Policy Changes

11. Construction projects estimated to cost over \$5,000,000 will undergo a third party review at the completion of the 30 percent design stage. This review is to confirm the project cost, schedule, and ability of the project to meet the proposed resource benefit. Additionally, projects that cost between \$1,000,000 and \$5,000,000 that staff has determined will benefit from a third party review will also undergo such review at the completion of the 30 percent design stage. Results of the third party review will be presented to the Governing Board for approval before the project can proceed to final design.



#### Item 8. SWFWMD Cooperative Funding Policy Changes

The following additional guidelines apply to potable alternative water supply projects:

- 14. Consistent with Section 373.707, Florida Statutes, the District shall prioritize funding for alternative water supply projects as follows:
  - Highest priority Alternative water supply projects owned, operated and controlled, or perpetually controlled by a Regional Water Supply Authority (RWSA).
  - Medium priority Alternative water supply projects that are not owned, operated and controlled, or perpetually controlled by a RWSA, but meet the definition of multijurisdictional.
  - Lowest priority Projects that do not meet the multijurisdictional criteria. Funding for these projects would be limited to consideration by the appropriate Basin Board(s). (note: modification to this policy will be discussed by the Board as circumstances arise)




#### Item 8. SWFWMD Cooperative Funding Policy Changes

The following additional guidelines apply to potable alternative water supply projects:


17. All potable alternative water supply projects will be required to identify the quantity of alternative water supply that will be made available upon completion of the project. It is the intent of the District's Governing Board that the quantity made available will be used as "base supply". The base supply will be clearly defined by the cooperator on a project-by-project basis-and will include, but not be limited to, the overall alternative water supply system capacity, typically expressed in million gallons per day, the expected annual average use for the life of the project, as well as the frequency and timing of use of the available alternative water supply quantities. The base supply defined by the cooperator will be reviewed and approved by the Governing Board as a part of the Cooperative Funding Initiative project review and budgeting process. The cooperative funding agreement between the District and the cooperator will include the base supply requirements approved by the Governing Board. The Governing Board may consider adjustments to a project's base supply quantity and definition by amendment of the cooperative funding agreement.












## Water Supply Authorities

Authorized by Chapter 373.713, Florida Statutes

 Created by Interlocal Agreement among four counties, pursuant to s. 163, F.S.



### Chapter 373, F.S., Statutory Charge


373.713(1) . . . regional water supply authorities may be created for the purpose of developing, recovering, storing, and supplying water for county or municipal purposes in such a manner as will give priority to reducing adverse environmental effects of excessive or improper withdrawals of water from concentrated areas.



### Chapter 373, F.S., Statutory Charge

 Plan for future water supplies for member governments





 Locate, develop, deliver wholesale water supply to member governments as needed



#### WRWSA

- Originally Created in 1977
  - Concern regarding water transfers
- Interlocal Agreement Amended several times
  - Most recently updated in 2014
- Citrus, Hernando, Marion and Sumter Counties - Signatories



### 373.713, F.S., Powers

- Develop, recover, store and supply water for county and municipal purposes
- After approval of electors, can levy ad valorem taxes up to .5 mills
- Collect, treat, store waste water

- Exercise eminent domain
- Issue revenue bonds
- Sue and be sued
- Borrow money & incur indebtedness
- Not engage in local distribution



#### Other Functions

- Forum to discuss regional/state water issues
- Provide for long-range water supply planning
- Provide a presence and input to State legislative process
- Assist local governments in water supply issues




#### Mission Statement

## LEGISLATIVE UPDATE March 10, 2017

#### **Budget:**

To date, there are 1,205 House appropriations project bills for a total of \$2,579,567,292 in funding requests. Although the House now requires that a separate project bill must be filed for funding requests, the Senate does not require the same. The Governor's 2017 Budget recommendations include \$65 million for springs restoration and \$100 million for water projects. The following are a few House appropriations project bills filed in our region:

**Citrus County Suncoast Parkway II Reclaimed Water**—(HB 3829 by Rep. Massullo) in the amount of \$6 million in non-recurring funds.

**Homasassa River Restoration**—(HB 2401 by Rep. Massullo) in the amount of \$350,000 in non-recurring funds.

Kings Bay Restoration—(HB 2315 by Rep. Massullo) in the amount of \$2 million in non-recurring funds.

**Silver Springs Nutrient Reduction**—(HB 2987 by Rep. Stan McClain) in the amount of \$300,000 in non-recurring funds.

#### Legislation:

The Authority is tracking several dozen bills including those summarized below, in alphabetical order.

**Aquifer Replenishment**—(SB 1438 by Senator Broxson/HB 755 by Rep. Albritton) would require new permit conditions for certain projects involving underground injection, and authorizes DEP to develop criteria for advanced water treatment. Although HB 755 has passed the House Committee on Natural Resources and Public Lands, DEP has indicated the bill requires input from stakeholders.

Coast-to-Coast Comprehensive Water Resource Program—(SB 10 by Senator Bradley/HB 761 by Rep. Altman) SB 10 was amended to expand the Lake Okeechobee Reservoir legislation in an attempt to win approval for Senate President Negron's top priority. SB 10 would: create a new revolving loan program for water storage and supply facilities, create a water reuse grant program, fund projects along the St. Johns River, and provide \$20 million for septic tank conversion in certain areas, among other things. SB 10 will next be considered by the Senate Appropriations Committee. HB 761 has not yet been heard in any committee.

**Reclaimed Water**—(SB 1686 by Senator Simmons/HB 1357 by Rep. Ponder) would authorize water reuse incentives and would direct DEP to recommend criteria for regulating direct potable reuse water by December 31, 2018.

Water and Land Constitutional Amendment—(SB 1082 by Senator Brandes/HB 663 by Rep. Peters) would set aside \$100 million each year for water supply and water resource development projects identified in a recovery or prevention strategy or in a regional water supply plan, among other things. Neither bill has been heard in any committee.

**Water Management**—(SB 1700 by Senator Farmer) would expand restricted activities and impose new requirements for water permit applicants to restore MFL's in the vicinity of Outstanding Florida Springs. No House companion at this time.

Water Oversight and Planning—(SB 1300 by Senator Gibson/HB 413 by Rep. Antone) would create a state-wide Water Oversight and Planning Advisory Council to address water supply and planning, water quality restoration and protection, flood protection and flood plain management, and natural systems protection and restoration. Neither bill has been heard in any committee.
